


# REMEMBERING RUTH MUELLER BELOVED SIU WOMEN'S CLUB CHARTER MEMBER

At our August board meeting we were saddened to learn of the passing of Charter Member Ruth Mueller on July 29th. On the celebration of her 101st birthday in March, Ruth was surrounded by her loving, devoted family and friends who had known her intimately for many years and loved her deeply. She was witty and radiant! She shared a photo taken in 1992 at a Holiday Tea, in Pam Wright's home, honoring Charter members of our Club and had fun identifying all who were in the photo! We are saving the photo and letter in our archives!

Ruth was actively engaged in our Club, in AAUW, the UN Association, and PEO. She continued to be supportive and interested in each organization's evolvement in the last decade when she was not able to attend events. She was an avid reader and missed our Book group.

Friends remember Ruth for her love of her German ancestry which was "Volga Deutch" as she referred to it, her sweet temper, always tolerant of others although having opinions that she would never impose on anyone else. She loved music and art, and she often recalled her beloved Vienna and the times that she and Bob, who was director of the SIU School of Music, had spent in that city. Bob would confide that there was not a mean bone in his wife's body. She would invite a friend over to play something for her on the grand piano in her living room. She was



an acute listener who could discern the real from the fake. She was always kind whether the friend played well or not. The friend knew when she was truly pleased because Ruth's eyes sparkled, and she would say "you've been practicing!".

Ruth was a treasure to SIU and to our entire community. As an Academic Advisor in the College of Education, she mentored and guided hundreds of students and encouraged them to learn from world class faculty and access incredible experiential opportunities and valuable network of support – the hallmarks of an SIU education since its inception. 
