We saw lionesses, cheetahs, storks, and elephants, as well as zebras, red-billed buffalo weavers, fish eagles, kudu, baboons, magpie shrikes, vervet monkeys (cheeky little food thieves), woolly-necked storks, crocodiles, water buffalo, southern ground hornbills, a leopard, giraffes, hippos, and more. Whew! Each day, we left camp at 6:30 a.m., and our incredibly knowledgeable guides made us coffee every mid-morning. We enjoyed a "sundowner" each evening as we watched the sun go down. (Yes—as shown in the picture—the mornings were a bit chilly!)

Our chairwoman clears her throat gently, and the room quiets. "Just a few items before we get to discussing the book." One can imagine that the original chairwoman, Mrs. Harold Kaplan, would be proud of today's vibrant group and our diverse selections.

The SIU Women's Club Book Club traces its roots back to the 1955–56 "Book Circle," which emerged as the Club transitioned from its Newcomers Group origins in the late 1940s. Early invitations read:

"Have you read the latest? No? Well, here's your chance, for we've prepared a list of books, worth more than a glance. We'll each buy one and pass them around, so we can read them all. Your time's your own, the pleasure great; join Book Circles this fall."

Today, members download books to devices, borrow from libraries, order online, or pass along treasured paperbacks. Though one of the Club's longest-running groups, we are far from a "dusty ole book club."

This year began with over 50 book suggestions, narrowed to a curated reading list. Members bring not only their books, but their insights, experiences, and friendship. Our notebook of past reads holds over 40 years of titles—a testament to shared stories and good conversation.

Selections span fiction, nonfiction, and various genres. Whether you're new or seasoned, every voice matters when the discussion begins. For us, finishing the book is just the beginning—of connection, curiosity, and conversation.
